Preparer's Notes

In order to maintain the original order of the materials, the George Washington University staff did very little rearranging and always used the original folder titles. Researchers should read the entire finding aid in order to see all the material pertinent for their projects. Often the same topic will appear in more than one series. The finding aid includes notes to assist researchers in finding all useful material. One example of a finding aid pathfinder is for the house histories. House histories appear in both the Graphics and Research Materials series. Most folders contain information for only one house, but some include research for two or three houses. For the folders with multiple houses, the folder has been placed in the proper box for the first house and notes are written in the finding aid for the other houses to point the researcher back to the original folder. This same procedure is used in the house section of the graphics series because often, the images are not identified except for the folder heading. Researchers should also be aware that although the collection has a series for graphics there is graphic material in other series.

Introduction

Robert Hughes, the graphics director for Washington Perspectives, Inc. (W.P.I.) and husband of Ruth Ann Overbeck donated this collection in April 2000. A second donation followed in June 2003. Ruth Ann Overbeck, an independent historian, founded W.P.I. in 1975. She recognized the need for a D.C. based history firm with an understanding of Washington history and resources. She served as president and directed all projects undertaken by the firm. The collection includes terrific information about many different subjects related to D.C. history. These topics include people such as Lillian Evanti, an African-American opera star, a survey of the buildings in the Deanwood neighborhood, and a lecture series for the Smithsonian Residential Associate program. The collection reflects all the different types of projects undertaken by W.P.I. These projects ranged both in size and in location including the District of Columbia and the larger metropolitan area of Virginia, Maryland, and West Virginia. There is also a small amount of research relate to Ruth Ann's hometown of Denison, Texas. One of the most popular services offered by W.P.I. was the house history. These histories ranged from brief outlines to fully developed historical surveys and often the completion of a historic preservation certificate application. The package also included an ink drawing of the house that many people used as stationary and note cards.

The bulk dates for the collection material range from approximately 1970 through 1995. The collection measures 46 clamshells, 1 oversize box, and 23 map tubes. The total size is approximately 28 linear feet. The collection is arranged in seven series. Within each series the material is arranged alphabetically by folder title. The house histories are arranged by address.

Agency History and Biography

Ruth Ann Overbeck founded Washington Perspectives, Inc. (W.P.I.) in 1975. The purpose of the organization as stated in the articles of incorporation was “ to conduct research, plan, and implement various cultural, historical, social and education programs, including, but not limited to, conducting guided tours, preparing historical and other reports, and to carry out any other activities within the general scope of the above.” The diversity of projects within this collection demonstrates that the firm achieved this purpose.

Most of the success of W.P.I. is attributable to Ruth Ann Overbeck. Ruth Ann first visited Washington, D.C. in the 1950s while still in high school in Texas. She attended college in Texas, but always planned to return to Washington. She did this in 1968, purchasing a house on Capitol Hill, and living in that home until her death in April 2000.

Ruth Ann's work as a historic preservation consultant and as the president of W.P.I. earned her a reputation as a thoughtful and dedicated scholar. She wrote numerous articles and worked on many reports for the D.C. government and community agencies. She conducted numerous walking tours of D.C., founded the preservation trust, a façade

easement trust, and served on many boards including Friendship House Association, Inc. and Capitol Hill Restoration Society. One of her final acts as an historian was to be interviewed for an oral history project about her experiences researching, working, and living in the Capitol Hill neighborhood. Ruth Ann had planned to write a book about Capitol Hill, but did not have the opportunity. The oral history project was her way to record her vast knowledge of Capitol Hill and Washington D.C. history and make it accessible to researchers. The donation to the George Washington University of these historical records represents Ruth Ann and Robert Hughes' efforts to accomplish the same objective. This collection and the work that will certainly come from its use by researchers is a fitting tribute to Ruth Ann Overbeck and allows her contribution to Washington history to continue.

Scope and Contents Note

The material in this collection is a terrific representation of the breath and depth of work done by Ruth Ann Overbeck as a historian in D.C. for thirty years. The collection has material for many projects from house histories for individual homeowners to a survey of the Upper Cardozo Columbia Heights neighborhood with oral histories and surveys of buildings such as the Tivoli Theater.

The collection will prove to be extremely useful for researchers exploring topics related to Washington, D.C. history. The D.C. Research Subseries within the Research Materials Series primarily includes notes, citations, and photocopies gathered by Ruth Ann and other W.P.I. employees for specific research projects. Often times the final product especially the house histories is included in the folders.

The collection does not contain much information about the administrative side of W.P.I. Series VII: W.P.I. Administration Records does have a small amount of financial records, but it is clearly only a sampling. The research records, however, do provide a picture of the types of projects undertaken by W.P.I. and the methods and efforts used by Ruth Ann Overbeck and the other W.P.I. historians.

The bulk dates for the collection material range from approximately 1970 through 1995. The collection measures 46 clamshells, 1 oversize box, and 23 map tubes. The total size is approximately 28 linear feet. The collection is arranged in seven series. Within each series the material is arranged alphabetically by folder title. The house histories are arranged by address.

Series Descriptions

SERIES I: Biographical Information

This series has one file with material about Ruth Ann Overbeck including her resume, articles about her, and some information about the W.P.I. and graphics director Robert Hughes.

SERIES II: Brochures

This series contains brochures about different activities in the District of Columbia and various states primarily on the East Coast.

SERIES III: Graphics

The series has images of District related topics and others from outside the D.C. area. Many of the topics within this series are also represented in Series VI and should be used together. In an effort to make the complimentary nature between the two series easier, the subseries within this series matches the subseries in Series VI.

SERIES IV: Maps, plats and blueprints

This series includes maps, plats, and blueprints collected as part of broader research efforts. The maps often match the topics in Series VI and were most likely products of that research. The processor placed these items in a separate series because of the storage needs of rolled and oversize items.

SERIES V: Publications

This series includes articles, newspaper clippings, and periodicals collected by Ruth Ann Overbeck and W.P.I. historians.

SERIES VI: Research Materials

This series is the largest of the collection and includes 80% of the collection comprising 35 of the 46 boxes. The series is divided into two subseries including material related to D.C. research and material for topics outside of the D.C. area. Within each subseries the material is arranged in alphabetical order.

**SERIES VII: Washington Perspectives Incorporation (W.P.I.) Administration
Records**

The material within this series is a sampling of the administrative workings of W.P.I. The type of material included is not inclusive to the type of material one may find produced by a small business. For example, there is a small amount of financial records and telephone logs, but no personnel records.
